Operational Environment

Persistent Threat of Iran

- Build and export of extensive missile forces
- Advancing maritime capabilities that threaten chokepoints for the free flow of energy resources and international commerce
- Undermining Middle East stability by supporting terrorist groups and military proxies
- Employment of Iran paramilitary forces and engaging in military provocations
- Conducting malicious cyber and information operations

Global Terrorist Groups (VEOs)

- ISIS and affiliates
- Degraded, but may reconstitute in short order


